Dear Old Providence Family,

By the time this newsletter reaches you I suspect that the outside will look much greener, and the weather will feel warmer! Perhaps it is the budding trees. Maybe it's seeing grass growing again (or in the case of the Manse, the green onions in the yard). You might have even seen daffodils emerging or robins in the yard! No matter what the sign, spring is here, and with spring comes so many tangible reminders of the resurrection and new life. Let us all glory in these reminders that point to newness of life. In addition, let us turn our minds to the passion of our Savior's crucifixion, the glory of His resurrection, and what these things really mean for us.

In I Corinthians 15, Paul addressed the church by talking about the Lord's resurrection and what it means for God's people. Some in the early church, and all outside the church, questioned the validity of Jesus rising from the dead. In verses 13 and 14 Paul wrote that <sup>13</sup> *If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised.* <sup>14</sup> *And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith.* What bold statements these are! Bold, yet perfectly reasonable. After all, if Jesus remained dead, what promises could He possibly offer? But the fact is that He rose again! In so doing He defeated death and Hell forever for those who trust in Him.

Paul would go on to write in verses 20 and 21 <sup>20</sup> But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. <sup>21</sup> For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. This passage reveals the beauty of Easter and the fact that though Christ was handed over as the perfect Lamb of God, death could not possibly hold Him. As a result, not only did Jesus pay for the sins of His people, He also points to our hope for the future as He is the evidence of rising from the dead. Another way of saying this is that His resurrection points to God's promise for all those who trust in Christ alone for their salvation. Christ's resurrection shows us that this life is not all there is. As a result, Easter is the central event of our existence as the people of God.

Would you consider celebrating with us this year? Our plans for this year's Easter services are contained in this newsletter, but we will gather at the Stone Hall (weather permitting) at 7:00 a.m. for our Sunrise Service. We will enjoy breakfast immediately after, go to Sabbath School at 9:00 a.m., and then have our regular service at 10:00 a.m. It would be wonderful to see you there. Let's celebrate our Lord's resurrection and all of God's promises together.
