Dear Old Providence Family,

Happy New Year! As we reflect on this past 2021, it's clear that Old Providence has been tremendously blessed. Not only have we navigated COVID's uncertainties well, but in the face of its unpredictable nature we have actually grown and prospered in significant ways! No doubt due to our sovereign Lord, but also thanks to your generosity, labors, and prayers, Old Providence membership has increased at an enviable rate. Our financial position has markedly improved through your selfless giving and the stewardship of our Deaconate and Session. And perhaps most remarkable is that, despite COVID's limitations and challenges imposed on our community, the ministries of Old Providence have flourished. *Monday Midday* has continued to provide a venue for fellowship and community outreach. Wednesday evening's *Bible Study and Prayer Meeting* not only lifted up the specific needs of our congregants each week and gave God praise for answering our prayers, but we also pored through the Old and New Testaments to study God's gracious plan and faithful execution of redemption. We also began a couple of brand new ministries in the fall: Old Providence hosted a home-school pod that serves elementary children in a broad curriculum of godly education. And a new ministry was recently seeded – *College & Career Fellowship*, which has already proven to be popular for those transitioning into the workforce.

It may surprise you to learn that Old Providence is now more popular beyond the borders of Augusta and Rockbridge counties. In 2021 we increased our digital footprint by delivering the Word of God online. Patrick's *Daily Devotionals* and our Sunday Worship messages were consumed by over 40,000 people - throughout 49 countries! - - all of which has been archived and maintained on Facebook and SermonAudio.com for expanded access. And as you know, Old Providence added the Pastoral Intern position in May, which I am humbled and honored to fill on behalf of the kingdom of God and to your service.

In addition to June's Newsletter that introduced Elizabeth and me, I have had the honor of spending the last eight months leading our Sunday Worship Services. The responsibility of preparing calls to worship and offering prayers on behalf of God's people is beyond weighty. Indeed, it is a labor of love, but one that bears a tremendous burden of pastoral care to handle the Word rightly. I thank you for entrusting me with that rich and rewarding responsibility.

In 2021 I was also provided opportunities to preach in July, October, and December. As you can imagine, communicating well from the pulpit takes time, and I appreciate your patience and encouragement as I hone that skill and become more comfortable. In addition to pulpit duties, I have regularly participated in visitation to those in need. Some of that has been with Patrick, but much has been conducted solo, visiting

our congregants who are infirm and knocking on community doors to share the ministries of Old Providence and invite new-comers to worship with us. I have also had the joy of filling in for Patrick to open Monday Midday as well as leading weekly chapel for the home-school pod. And while my 58-years might not point to this, I have very much enjoyed leading studies for our Old Providence Youth Group (and hope to improve my skills of kickball as they teach me not to aim it towards Kristi or Carrie, who catch it every time).

An important part of the pastoral ministry is not just teaching, preaching, and leading various fellowships, but also working with those who are on the cusp of departing this world. To this end, I have met with families who have lost loved ones and much of my growth as a pastoral intern has come from attending funerals and solemnly assisting Patrick to conduct graveside services. Perhaps equally so, I have further benefited from those who have approached me for biblical guidance and pastoral advice. Counseling goes both ways, and it is often those who need help who end up being a blessing.

All of this has been a labor of love and I trust that your 2021 brought you closer to trusting Jesus and a deeper fellowship with His Old Providence family. As for me personally, getting to know each of you has been a blessing and has caused me to seek His constant help to imitate Christ as expressed in Philippians 2:3, "In humility, count others more significant than yourselves." That verse is the cornerstone of every pastor's call to service and I am grateful to each of you for your ongoing friendship and love. As I wind up seminary this season (degree will be conferred in May), I look forward to the trials of ordination imposed by Patrick and the Virginia Presbytery. But I more so look forward to engaging with, and for you.

As we transition together into 2022, please know that the Lord has special plans for you and for Old Providence. We are all under His gracious and tender care, and whatever He has in store for us, we will persevere together in the blessings and challenges that He sees fit to lay before us. Whatever circumstances 2022 presents, our Creator and Savior sovereignly oversees all of it and ensures that we, His sheep, are fed, growing in grace, and able to live contently and in peace as people unified in Christ - - all to His glory. May you experience a most blessed New Year.
