Dear Old Providence Family,

God is good—what a simple phrase this is, but what grand implications it has! As I reflect on my own life, I can see God's sovereign hand at work, directing my paths and shaping the reality of my existence. Praise be to God that this is true not only when I think back on good times and positive experiences, but also when I consider times of great difficulty. I know that I am not unique in this practice. As your pastor, you have given me the great honor of ministering to you in both good times and bad. I have heard you express the same sentiment in times of difficulty and in times of ease: No matter what, God is good.

First, let me say "Thank You!" for being such an encouragement to me. But second, let me encourage you to hang on to your faith and continue in the practice of taking the time to remember God's blessings. On Father's Day I had the honor to preach from Psalm 103. The focus of my sermon was on God functioning as our Heavenly Father. In just 14 verses God reveals so many ways in which he cares for us, renews us, forgives us, and enables us to serve him. God does all of these things by His mercy alone, through grace alone. Yet we must be on guard. In the first two verses of Psalm 103 we are given two commands. The first command is, in light of God's mercy, to praise the Lord and bless His name with every bit of ourselves. The second is to not forget what God has done.

God's Word teaches us something about ourselves. We have a natural tendency to forget the Lord. We can forget God when our life is difficult and when trouble comes. We do this by taking our eyes off God and focusing on our circumstances. Yet, much in the same way, when we experience times of prosperity and ease, we can also forget God. We do this by resting on our circumstances and forgetting how much we need God's grace. Let me encourage you to heed the command of Scripture—praise the Lord and remember his goodness at all times. Practicing gratitude is a life changing discipline that will bring you immeasurable peace.
