Dear Old Providence Family,

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! It is summertime in Spottswood and as I write, I do so with such joy at the prospect of more and more things returning to normal. Part of this return to normal means Homecoming and Special Services at Old Providence! I am excited to announce that Rev. Kyle Sims, pastor at Lancaster First ARP Church in South Carolina, will return and be our guest speaker.

Our Homecoming service will be Sunday morning, July 25th, at 11:00 a.m., and will be followed by a covered dish meal in Providence Hall immediately after. We will have Sabbath School at 10:00 a.m., our regular time, but there will be no 9:00 a.m. service on July 25th. Special Services begin the same day at 7:00 p.m. and will continue Monday through Wednesday night at 7:00 p.m. And yes, we will enjoy an ice cream/ dessert social on Wednesday night, after our closing service. I hope that as you read this you are as excited as I am about returning to some form of normalcy. But even more so, I hope that you will commit yourself to prayer for these services and that you are looking forward to spending this time together.

While the time of Covid has been difficult in many ways, Covid's affect on many churches has been near disastrous. Many studies have been released, but what seems to be the case is that most churches have seen major decreases in attendance. According to the newest studies, and speaking in general terms, most churches have seen one third of their people stay and be committed to worshipping in person, and are still an active part of the church, while another third of the congregation has participated online and pledges to return to church at some time. But what about the final third of the typical congregation? Studies have shown that most churches have lost one third of their congregation. People have left the church and most likely won't be coming back.

While every case is unique, and while I would not presume to paint with too broad of a brush stroke, the results of these studies point to an undeniable fact. I don't know who said it first, but I have found it to be true that one of the biggest dangers of missing church is that soon enough you won't be missing it. Church is not only important, it is irreplaceable. God has commanded that his people gather together to worship Him. Furthermore, God has commanded that we unite together in spreading the gospel. The promise of our Savior is that He would build His Church. But very practically speaking, you need to be in church. You need the fellowship and encouragement of other believers. You need to hear the preaching and teaching of God's Word. You need to worship God and focus on His greatness.

Praise be to God that Old Providence has continued to grow, even throughout Covid. We have not seen decreases in attendance, but rather, an increase. Even so, with Homecoming and Special Services coming, now is an excellent time to commit yourself anew to being a regular part of the life of the church. If you can't attend Old Providence, be sure to align yourself with a Bible believing church, and make attendance and participation a priority in your life. If you can attend Old Providence, know that you are welcome and that we look forward to seeing you soon
