Dear Old Providence Family,

Well the air has chilled and the leaves have begun to fall. Thanksgiving Day is coming soon and then, before you know it, Christmas will be upon us. People react differently to this time of year. For some, the holiday season is a time of wonder and magic that hearkens back to fond childhood memories. But for others, the holiday season brings with it a time of varied emotions. While there is joy, the loss of loved ones or separation from family and friends can make the holiday season difficult. And for others still the holiday season holds little or no joy at all. Nostalgia can be both a blessing and a curse.

No matter where you find yourself on the spectrum, let me encourage you to focus on the real reason for celebration. The phrase "Jesus is the Reason for the Season" has been somewhat overused but still, nevertheless, rings true. With Thanksgiving Day quickly approaching, take the time to consider why you should be thankful. Be intentional about reflecting on God's blessings and remember the words of the Psalmist in Psalm 100 where the reader is instructed to KNOW that the Lord is God and to remember that He is good and that His love endures forever. Our Doxology (praise) must be based on our Theology (the knowledge of the Lord).

Also remember the words of the prophet Jeremiah who, in Lamentations 3, laments over the destruction that befell Jerusalem and his own personal loss. Even so, Jeremiah concluded that no matter what circumstances he faced, the Lord's love and mercies never end. Like Jeremiah, you too can proclaim "Great is Thy Faithfulness". Remember these things as we enter into this season of celebration and remembrance. The Lord is good. His love endures forever.
