Dear Old Providence Family,

Obviously, I'm writing in jest. Of course you've heard about the election! If you've used any sort of media, whether it be your television, or social media, or if you've read a newspaper, I'm quite certain that you are well aware of the fact that November 3rd is election day. I'm also sure that you have heard much of the sentiment floating around this election, too—that this is the most important election of our lifetimes. We have been told to vote as if our lives depend on it! That this election is a matter of life or death! If ______ wins, life is over as we know it! Or if ______ wins, all of these horrible things will come to pass!

Please understand that I am not trying to position myself as a naysayer. I am not saying that the presidential election at hand is unimportant or inconsequential. On the contrary, I believe the presidential election is of vast importance. Also please understand that I am doing my best to ensure that my own political opinions remain my own, and that they do not enter into this article. All of these things being said, allow me to offer a reminder of what God reveals in His Word. In Psalm 146: 3-4 God says "3 Do not put your trust in princes, in mortal men who cannot save.

4 When their breath departs, they return to the earth; on that very day their plans perish." What a fitting reminder this is! In the past I have preached about the lack of spirituality in our nation. I've talked about how religion is vanishing and what is left is a mass of immorality. I was wrong.

The problem we face isn't a lack of religion in the United States (and the world around us). The problem we really face is that, for some, politics *is* religion, and I happen to believe it's the biggest and fastest growing religion in the world. Political religion leads people to conclude that salvation and hope comes from political candidates. Political religion leads people to despair and hopelessness when one political candidate wins and the other loses. Political religion destroys Christian testimony. God's Word offers an alternative. After giving His command in verses 3 and 4, in Psalm 146: 5 God says "5 Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord his God,". Again, please understand that I am not

negating the importance of our political process. I am not saying that the office of president is unimportant. In fact, forget about what I've said. Listen to God's Word. Make sure your hope is in God, and God alone. He is the sovereign One. No matter what happens November 3rd and after, no matter who is president, Jesus is and always will be King. Make sure you are trusting in Him.
