Dear Old Providence Family,

Happy Thanksgiving! And greetings from Namibia. At least that's where I am as I type this article for our newsletter. If you're wondering why I'm writing from Namibia (located north of South Africa and west of Botswana), it's because I am representing our denomination, the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, at the International Conference of Reformed Churches. Practically speaking, this means I am in Africa with representatives from 47 other Presbyterian and reformed denominations from all over the world. Last night I ate supper with a pastor from Uganda and another from South Sudan. Just now, at lunch, I ate with a pastor from Indonesia. I've also had the privilege of meeting with pastors from India, South Korea, Northern Ireland, Holland, Scotland, and too many other places to list. While our conversations have varied, the common theme present throughout all of my interactions has been rising persecution toward Christianity around the world.

Brothers from India spoke of radical Hindus finding their churches and beating Christians to within an inch of their lives. These Christians have to worship in secret and must hide their numbers in order to protect themselves from genocide. Brothers from South Sudan spoke of the horrors of their civil war with Sudan and how radical Islam wants to destroy Christianity. Still others spoke of government sponsored persecution and being denied the opportunity of buying land and operating churches. The pastor I met from Indonesia spoke of worshiping in silence when Muslim radicals were in their area and were looking for Christians to murder. One delegation from the Republic of the Congo was intercepted at the border and could not even make it to the conference. While I knew that persecution was a reality for many Christians, this conference has made persecution all too real.

Perhaps you noticed that I began this article by saying "Happy Thanksgiving!" You may be wondering why I am so joyful as I write about the persecution that our brothers and sisters in Christ face on a daily basis. The answer is simple. I can't remember the last time I have been with this many joyful people. I mentioned that the common theme present in all of my interactions was the reality of persecution. Even so, the common attitude exhibited by these brothers is that of pure joy. Why? How? Again, the answer is simple. They have chosen to remember to count their trials as pure joy, as James 1 says. They have remembered what our Lord said in Matthew 5 when he said "Blessed are you when others insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me." They have remembered what the apostle Paul wrote in Philippians 4 when he said, "Rejoice in the Lord always: and again I say rejoice!" They have remembered Psalm 107 and the call to "give thanks to Jehovah, for He is good." And they have remembered that Jesus commands his people to rejoice, for our treasure is in Heaven.

In light of the fact that Thanksgiving is just around the corner, will you remember these things? Will you rejoice in the Lord always? Will you take the time to consider all that the Lord has done for you and the fact that you enjoy freedoms that so few in the world have ever experienced? Before you say "yes, absolutely!", remember that the biblical concept of remembering always includes action. How will you give thanks? How will you show your gratitude? Let me suggest that you start with joy and being characterized by gratitude. And let me further suggest that you commit yourself anew to worshiping the Lord and walking in His ways, including being a regular part of worship in church, with God's people. This is just a start, but it's a good start. Thanksgiving falls flat without actually giving thanks. But having an attitude of thanks-giving results in real joy.
