What an exciting time it is to be part of Christ's Kingdom! October 31st marks the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther nailing his 95 Theses to the door of the All Saints' Church in Wittenburg, Germany. His act of faithfulness was one of many events that sparked the Protestant Reformation, thus changing the world!

Much has happened in the Church over the last 500 years. In His providence, God has seen fit to unite Christians together under many different denominations. Some denominations have risen and some have fallen, but in the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church we praise God for His faithfulness to us over the generations.

In order to keep churches informed our denomination publishes various updates and items from its General Synod meeting. Some things to consider from our General Synod meeting are:

Bonclarken - The General Synod encourages all churches to encourage and assist their members in attending the various camps/conferences/retreats hosted by Bonclarken.

Book of Discipline - The draft of the revised Book of Discipline should be received as information, and made available to members, churches, and presbyteries for study and comment.

CEM - The Synod encourages presbyteries to take full advantage of CEM's (Christian Education Ministries) training opportunities and make use of the ARP Bookstore for equipping the saints.

Erskine - The ARP churches, presbyteries and General Synod should pray often and regularly for Erskine College and Seminary's board, faculty, staff and student body.

ONA - The churches and presbyteries should set aside time to specifically pray for congregational and personal evangelistic fervor, church planter recruitment and church vitality within the ARPC.

Worship - The General Synod encourages individuals and sessions to submit nominations of individuals qualified and willing to serve on the Committee on Worship to Synod's Committee on Nominations (and) the General Synod encourages local sessions to review the Directory of Public Worship annually and consider their own Lord's Day public worship in light of the Directory's teaching.
