Homecoming 2019 – A Centennial Celebration

In May 1916, The Old Providence Congregation approved a joint report from the elders, deacons, and trustees that recommended a new church be built to replace the Old Brick Church. The brick building, which had been used for worship since the 1850's, had become too small for the congregation.

At the same meeting, a building committee was selected. Following this selection, the project continued as follow:

1917 – Architect selected, contractor selected, construction began in late 1917

1918 - Construction continued through the year

1919 – Building committee reported carpenter work "about done" and recommended to move ahead with tearing down the "old" brick building.

November 2, 1919 - First Service in the new building

1920 – 1921 – Finishing touches on new building

May 27 - May 29, 1921 - Dedication Ceremonies

To celebrate the "centennial" year of our present sanctuary, the session has approved Sunday, November 3rd, as "Homecoming Sabbath" for 2019.

On October 27th, Rev. Malphrus will take his message from Jeremiah 6:16, the same text as Rev. L.I. Echols used on October 26, 1919, the last service in the Old Brick Church.

On Homecoming, November 3rd, Rev. Malphrus will use as his text Joshua 3:4, the same text Rev. Echols used for the first service in the new sanctuary. Other parts of the service will be similar to those used in 1919.

Following the worship service, we will enjoy the traditional homecoming meal. We hope you will plan to worship and celebrate with us on this special day.


