Dear Old Providence Friends and Family,



I hope that this newsletter finds all of you doing very well and enjoying the change of seasons. October is a special month to me. Not only does October usher in the autumn season (my own personal favorite), it also reminds me that God is active in our world today. October reminds me of this because of one day in particular—October 31. And no, I'm not talking about Halloween. I'm talking about Reformation Day, the day that we remember God's work through the Protestant Reformation. We celebrate Reformation Day in October because on October 31, 1517, a German monk named Martin Luther nailed a list of 95 propositions to the door of All Saints' Church in Wittenberg, Germany. In his list of 95 items, Luther questioned many tenants of the Roman Catholic church and the corruption that was pervasive throughout both its practices and its theology. The Lord used this simple act of faithfulness, along with others of its kind, to spark a revolution that changed the course of human existence as we know it. 500 years later, we can still appreciate the fact that the Lord intervened in the events of our world.

I have a question for you. Do you believe the Lord still intervenes in the events of our world? Do you know that God can still change the unchangeable? Not only *can* God still change the unchangeable, He does so every day. I say this because of the beautiful promise Jesus made in Matthew 16:18 to build His Church. When Jesus made this promise, he was not talking about buildings, denominational distinctions, or programs. Instead, the Church (spelled with a capital "C" for a reason) that Jesus promised to build is made up of those who are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for their salvation. Similarly, Jesus made another promise in John 6:37 saying "All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out." (English Standard Version).

The reason promises like the ones found in Matthew 16 and John 6 are so important is that they point to the fact that God is active in our world today. God is still saving people and Jesus is still building His Church. Do you see how miraculous and wonderful this is? I hope so, because as we survey the landscape of current events, both on a national and worldwide scale, it would be very easy to lose heart. The temptation we face is to think the world has spiraled out of control and that the only solution is for Jesus to come back.

In fact, much of the prevailing sentiment present among God's people, though many wouldn't say it this way, is that things are going to get so bad that Jesus has to come back. This is not the message of the Bible and does not represent the hope of God's promises. Certainly, Jesus returning would fix everything. But do not forget the hope of the Gospel or the character of God. God has changed the unchangeable. If you're trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation, then you're living proof that God is still bringing hope in the midst of hopelessness. I'm proof of that too. Dwell on these things and do not lose heart. Bask in the hope and power of God's faithfulness.
